Gentlemen: The Ford car which has been used by the Superintendent of Parks for the past three years is now so worn that we feel that repairs to it would be an extravagance. This car can be turned in on a new one for \$150.00 leaving a balance to be paid of \$465.00.

Unfortunately, due to the much higher wages which we have been obliged to pay during the past year for the maintenance of our parks there is no balance in our appropriation for miscellaneous expense which can be used for this purpose. An automobile is absolutely necessary for the superintendent particularly for the quick transportation of men and tools from one park to another. We respectfully request that the

Board be allowed to make this purchase, the amount to be charged against our appropriation for the coming year.

As you know it has always been the policy of this Board not to exceed the appropriation made by the Council and therefore we make this request in advance.

Special Committee

Ann Arbor, Michigan, March 1st, 1920.

To the Honorable, the Common Council of Ann Arbor.

Gentlemen: The undersigned, to whom was referred the question of adopting Eastern Standard time for the summer months, as the official time for the City of Ann Arbor, by your honorable body under date of February 16th, last, begs leave to report as follows:

We have taken up the matter of advancing our clocks one hour for the summer months with the University authorities and have endeavored to ascertain the feeling of the public in the matter and it seems to us to be the general wish of the great majority of our citizens to have our time advanced one hour. We realize that this will perhaps cause some inconvenience to some of our citizens. However, it must be borne in mind that no matter what time we have or what time we adopt someone will be inconvenienced by it and we feel that it is for the general good of the city that a change in time be had. It has always caused more or less inconvenience in our city, owing to the fact that the City of Detroit has been running on Eastern Standard time for the past number of years and we therefore feel that in view of all the facts and circumstances that the advancement of the clocks one hour, for the summer months, commencing with the last Sunday in March at 2 o'clock a. m. and running until the last Sunday in October at 2 o'clock a. m. which are the months covered by the Federal act which was enacted by Congress as a daylight saving measure during the war, would meet with the approval of the majority of our citizens.

We therefore recommend that this body adopt what is known as Eastern Standard time as the official time of the City of Ann Arbor during the months above named. We would further recommend that the County Board of Supervisors be requested to cooperate in this matter and make this the official time for the county.
