#### Sewer Committee Report.

To the Honorable, the Common Council,

Gentlemen: Your Sewer Committee, to whom was referred the estimates and reports of the City Engineer, relative to the construction of lateral sewers in sewer district No. 95, on Pauline Boulevard, from end of present sewer west 250 feet; No. 96, on Fifth ave., from John st., north 300 feet, begs leave to report that we have had such estimates and reports, as well as the resolution of Council, under consideration, and have made due inquiries relating thereto, and have heard all persons desiring to be heard in the premises, and your committee is of the opinion that there is necessity for the construction of such lateral sewers in said districts, and that special taxing or assessment districts ought to be fixed by the Common Council upon and against which the construction of such sewers may be charged, street intersections excepted, pursuant to the ordinance in such case made and provided.

Your committee further recommends that resolutions fixing the boundaries of said districts be prepared by the City Engineer, and the Board of Public Works ordered to advertise for bids for the construction of above named sewers.

Your committee further recommends that lateral sewer be constructed on Day st., from Cambridge road to Wayne st., and that the City Engineer be instructed to prepare plans, specifications and estimate of cost of construction.

Your committee further recom-

mends that action be deferred on construction of sanitary sewer on North Main st., from present sewer to city limits as several of the adjoining property owners have so requested.
