IN RE: City of Ann Arbor vs. Good Roads Construction Co., and the Chicago Bonding and Surety Company.

In the above entitled cause, which was a suit upon the bond of the Good Roads Construction Company, for repairs made to the Division Street pavement, a judgement was directed in the May term of the Circuit Court by Judge George W. Sample for the sum of \$3,887.13 and the costs were taxed in the sum of \$60.75, making a total of

\$3,947.88.
