George W. Sample, Circuit Judge, several months ago and on Nov. 6th an opinion was handed down by the Circuit Judge in which he held that the County Treasurer was not entitled to the fund and the petition for the writ of mandamus was dismissed, the Circuit Judge holding that the State Dog Law in no wise conflicted with our City Ordinance relative to the licensing of dogs.
