I am of the opinion that no liability attaches to the City of Ann Arbor because of this injury. Section 100 of the charter of the City of Ann Arbor, as amended in 1913, provides, among other things, as follows:

"And, provided further, that no civil action shall be maintained against the city for damages or injuries to persons or property sustained in consequence of street, highway, bridge, culvert, sidewalk or cross walk being defective, out of repair, unsafe, dangerous or obstructive, unless that it appear that written notice of the particular defective, unsafe, dan-gerous or obstructed condition of such street, highway, bridge, culvert, sidewalk or crosswalk was actually given to the Board of Public Works; and that there was a failure or neglect within a reasonable time after the giving or such notice to repair or remove the defect, danger or obstruction compained of."

No written notice having been received by the Board of Public Works of any defect in the street Reichert—14. or sidewalk at the point where the in ury is alleged to have occurred Council adjourned. a suit for damages for injuries, such as is alleged to have resulted

not therefore be maintained.
