Sewer Committee Report

To the Honorable, the Common Council.

Gentlemen:

Your Sewer Committee, to whom was referred the estimate and report of the City Engineer, relative to the construction of lateral sewer in Lateral Sewer District No. 112, on John street from Fifth avenue to Division street, begs leave to report that we have had such estimate and report as well as the resolution of Council under consideration and have made due inquiries relating thereto and have heard all persons desiring to be heard in the premises, and your committee is of the opinion that there is necessity for the construction of such lateral sewer in said district, and recommends that special taxing or assessment district be fixed by the Common Council upon and against which the construction of such sewer be charged, street intersections excepted pursuant to the ordinance in such case made and provided. Your committee further recommends that resolution fixing the boundaries of said district be prepared by the City Engineer and the Board of Public Works ordered to advertise for bids for the construction of said sewer.

Your committee further recommends that Lottie E. Harkins et al. be granted permission to construct lateral sewer and connect same with lateral sewer on Dexter avenue in accordance with their petition presented to Council tonight and referred to Sewer Committee.
