Sewer Committee Report.

To the Honorable, the Common Council,

Gentlemen:

Your Sewer Committee respectfully recommends as follows:

1. That lateral sewers be constructed on Vinewood Boulevard from Wayne-st. to city limits, on Dexter-av. from present sewer to city limits, and on Charleton-av. and Abbott-st. from the west line of Killins Heights addition about 234 feet west, and that the City Engineer be instructed to prepare plans, specifications and estimates of cost for said lateral sewers; and that the constructions of said sewers is deemed and declared to be necessary public improvements.

2. That the plans, specifications and estimates of cost of replacement sanitary sewer from Washington st. south across University property to intersection of E. University-av. and Washtenaw-av. and for replacement sewer on Washtenaw-av. from E. University-av. to Church st. as approved by Board of Public Works July 14, 1922, be approved; and the Board of Public Works be instructed to advertise for bids for construction of replacement sanitary sewer from Washington st. south across University property to intersection of E. University-av. and Washtenaw-av. and proceed with construction of said sewer in accordance with communication from University of Michigan received April 17, 1922.
