Gentlemen:

Your Sewer Committee, to whom was referred the estimates and reports of the City Engineer, relative to the construction of Lateral Sewers in Lateral Sewer Districts No. 114, on Vinewood-blvd., from Wayne-st. to city limits; No. 115, on Dexter-av., from Station 925 to the city limits; No. 116, on Charlton-av. from Virginia-av. west 394 feet; No. 117, on Abbott-av. from Virginia-av 394 feet begs leave to report that we have had such estimates and reports as well as resolution of council under consideration and have made inquiries relating thereto and have heard all persons desiring to be heard in the premises, and your committee is of the opinion that there is necessity for the construction of said lateral sewers in said districts, and recommends that special taxing or assessment districts be fixed by the common council upon and against which the construction of such sewers be charged, street intersections excepted, pursuant to the ordinance in such case made and provided. Therefore, it is hereby ordered that stone or cement sidewalks be graded, built and constructed in the city of Ann Arbor on and along the following property:

Ann Arbor Public School, school property near Ford garage; the E 24 3-4 ft. of lot 4 and the W. 33 ft. of lot 5, B. 1 S., R. 6 East.

First Presbyterian church, E. Huron-st. front of Presbyterian church; lots 7 and 8, B. 1 S., R. 6 East.

First Presbyterian church, W. side Division from Washington-st. to Huron; lots 7 and 8, B. 1 S., R. 6 East.

Luther and Dora Gillette, W. side Division from Washington-st. to Huron—The N. 52 ft. of the W. 33 ft. of lot 9 and the N. 52 ft. of the E. 49 1-2 ft. of lot 10, B. 1 S., R. 6 E.
