To The Legislature of Michigan.

The municipalities of the State vigorously profest against the proposed taxation of their properties used for supplying their citizens with light, hat, power water and other necessities.

They represent that such taxation is contrary to the time-honored principles of American Government, and of the Common Law upon which our jur'sprudence is s an unwise burden on a useful public service, tends to curtail the enjoyment of modern conveniences in smaller communicies and among the poor r classes, and unless accompanied by taxation of all governmental agencies will re-

> We urge that House Bill No. 271 to amend the tax exempt on statut so as to exclude municipally owned property from such exemption be defeated.
