Ald. Johnson, presented the fol-

its third reading.

An ordinance to amend an or-
dinance entitled "An Ordinance re-
lative to the Use of Streets and
Other Public Places." passed Nov.
4, 1895; approved Nov. 5 1895 am-
ended June 5 1899; amended Octo-
ber 20, 1913.

The Common Council of the City
of Ann Arbor ordain:

Section 1 That Section 15 of an
ordinance entitled "An Ordinance
Relative to the Use of Streets and
Other Public Places." Passed Nov-
ember 4, 1895; approved Novem-
ber 5, 1895; amended June 5 1899
amended October 20, 1913; be and
the same is hereby amended to
read as follows:

Section 15 No person, firm or
corporation shall move, transport
or convey any building, car or oth-
er similar bulky or heavy object
into; across or along any street,
alley or other public place of this
city without previously obtaining
a permit from the Board of Public

Works therefor. To obtain the
said permit the said person, firm
or corporation shall submit an
application in writing to the
said board, in which shall
be set forth the thing to be
moved, the place from which it
is to be taken, and the means to
be used for its transportation, and
the said applicant shall also if so
required by the said Board, file a
bond in a sum to be fixed by the
said Board, said sum not to exceed
Twenty Thousand dollars, with
such conditions as the said Board
or City Attorney shall deem prop-
er in the premises, to protect the
said city from any damages or ac-
tions at law that might arise or be
brought on account of any negli-
gence on the part of the said per-
son, firm or corporation, in con-
ducting the said removal, and to
compel the restoration of any side-
walk, crosswalk, curbing, pave-
ment or street surface disturbed,
injured, removed or encumbered in
said process of removal to a per-
fect condition, satisfactory to the
said board. The permit of the
said Board of Public Works shall
designate the route to be followed
through the streets of this city, and
the time within which the said re-
moval shall be affected and any
necessary repairs upon the streets
in consequence thereof completed.
The said person, firm or corpora-
tion shall remove the said building
or other bulky or heavy object, by
the route designated by the said
board within the time limited in
said permit, and in such a manner
as to cause the least possible ob-
struction to public travel. No such
building or other similar bulky or
heavy object shall be halted for the
night so as to obstruct any side-
walk or crosswalk, or in the inter-
section of streets and any side-
walk, crosswalk, curbing, pave-
ment or street surface disturbed,
encumbered, or injured in the
course of the said removal shall be
promptly restored to a perfect con-
dition, satisfactory to the said
Board of Public Works by the said
person, firm or corporation.

This ordinance shall take effect
and be in force ten days after legal
publication thereof.

Gentlemen:

Your Sewer Committee respectfully recommends that the plans, specifications and estimate; for construction of storm sewer on 14th st. from Belser st. to Volland st. on Volland st. from 14th st. to Camden Court, on Camden Court from Volland st. to Geddes ave. and on Geddes ave. from Camden Court to Observatory st.; storm sewer on S. Main st. from Packard st. to Jefferson st. and on W. Jefferson st. from Main st. to the main storm sewer; storm sewer on S. State st. from Dewey ave. to Boulevard Drive, as approved by the Board of Public Works, April 13, 1923, be approved and the Board of Public Works be instructed to advertise for bids and proceed with the construction of said storm sewers according to charter and ordinance governing same.

Your Committee further recommends that lateral sewers be constructed on Seventh st. from Davis ave to Pauline Blvd., and on Daniel st. from Hiscock st. to Summit st., and that the City Engineer be instructed to prepare plans, specifications and estimates of cost for said lateral sewers.
