Report of Public Hearing.

Ann Arbor, Mich., June 8, 1923.
To the Honorable, the Common Council,

Gentlemen:

I submit the following report of the meeting of the Common Council held in the council chamber, City Hall, Ann Arbor, Michi-

gan, June 8, 1923, at 7 o'clock p. m., eastern standard time, pursuant to legal publication and notice of said meeting together with copy of proposed ordinance and map showing proposed use districts; which said notice was published in The Ann Arbor Times News May 22, 1923; for the purpose of hearing all persons interested in the proposed zoning ordinance, which was given its first reading by title, passed to and given its second reading and referred to ordinance committee at the regular meeting of the common council held May 7, 1923, which said ordinance is more specifically described by title as follows:

"An ordinance regulating, restricting and restricting the location of residences, trades, industries, businesses and the location of buildings designed for specified uses, and establishing the boundaries of districts for the said purposes; providing for and establishing set back lines and providing for the violation of said ordinance."

The meeting was called to order by President Mark B. Sugden, and the following members were present: Alderman Johnson, Slauson, Lucas, Markey, Donnelly, Spathelf, Moore, Freeman, White Norr's, Gram, and President; together with City Officials consisting of George E. Lewis, Mayor, and Roscoe O. Bonisteel, City Attorney, and sixty-five citizens of the City of Ann Arbor who had assembled for the purpose of hearing a discussion of the proposed zoning ordinance and to be heard on the questions relating thereto.

President Sugden opened the meeting by calling for remarks from any of those who were opposed to the question of zoning in

principle. No one spoke in opposition to zoning in principle.

The President then called upon citizens for suggested changes or criticism in the proposed ordinance and suggested changes were made from several citizens.

The President then called for general remarks from any one present to give their views with regard to zoning and to make suggested changes in the ordinance as proposed.

Only one person spoke in opposition to zoning as a principle and the remarks in opposition to zoning at the conclusion of the meeting were made by a citizen who came at a late hour.

Announcement was made by the City Attorney that this was a public meeting, that every one wishing an opportunity to be heard would be given an opportunity to be heard, and after considerable discussion as to changes in the outlines of boundaries of use districts and after every one being heard who desired to be heard, the meeting was duly adjourned.
