circulation.

bel'eve the fundamen'al 1 reason for publication of the counc'l proceedings and proceedings of the Board of Public Works 's to keep the public informed as to what the council and board are doing, consequently it is extremely important that this information as to c'rculation of the newspaper be given in order that if possible, it sha'l reach the largest number of taxpayers.

I do not believe that the difference in submission of price for the work is commensurate with the publicity that would be given to the proceedings in a publication

with a larger circulation.

I do not see how under the terms of our charter a weekly paper can publish the proceedings of the Board of Public Works and the Council with n the time specified by the charter which is mandatory as to time of publicaproceedings The  $\mathbf{of}$ council must be printed within one week from the date of its meeting; the proceedings of the Board

of Fublic Works must be published within five days from the date of its meeting, which said bodies meet respectively on firs' and third Monday's and Wednesdays of each month; also there are many special meetings.

Other legal publications must be made from time to time giving notices of hearings of the several bod'es of the city and it will be difficult to handle this matter and expedite the business of the city. if published in the weekly paper.
