#### **Curb and Gutter Boundaries and Order of Assessments**

By. Ald. Moore:

Resolved, that the following curbs and gutters: On Wells-st. from Packard-st. to Forest-av., known as District No. 24; On Forest-av. from Wells-st. to Cambridge-av., known as District No. 28; On Wall-st. from Broadway to river, known as District No. 50; On Division-st. from Cross-st. to Hill-st., known as District No. 51; On White-st. from McKinley-av. to end of White-st., known as District No. 52; On Onondaga-st. from Hill-st. to Dorset road, known as District No. 53; On North Thayer-st. from Ann-st. to Catherine-st., known as District No. 54; On West Madison-st. from Main-st. to Ashley-st., known as District No. 55; On Brooks-st. from Miller-av. to north line of Spring Hill Addition, known as District No. 56; On Washington-hgts., known as District No. 57; On Ingalls-st. from Huron-st. to Washington-st., known as District No. 58; On South Ashley-st. from Jefferson-st. to Madison-st., known as Dis-

trict No. 59; On Moore-st. from Broadway to Pontiac-st., known as District No. 60; On Catherine-st. from State-st. to Div'son-st., known as District No. 61; within the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, heretofore ordered, in the opinion of the Common Council, are and are hereby deemed and declared to be necessary public improvements.

Resolved, further, that all the lands, tenements and premises hereinafter mentioned in each particular district are deemed and declared to be benefited by the construction and completion of the respective curb and gutter heretofore ordered and it is hereby ordered and determined that all the costs of the said respective public improvements, street intersections and 50 per cent of the balance of the cost of said public improvements excepted shall be and is hereby ordered to be levied on and assessed against the lands, tenements and premises situated in the respective special assessment districts hereinafter designated, and the said special assessment districts are hereby fixed as follows, to-wit:

#### **District No. 24.**

Lots 34, 35, 68, and 69 Miller's Addition.

Lot; 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63. and 64 Eberbach's Addition.

The west 20 feet of lot 55 Eberbach's Addition.

#### **District No. 28**

Lots 1 to 8 inclusive, the east 60 feet of lot 9 and lot 10 Miller's Addition.

The west one half of lots 1 and 2, lots 3, 24, 25, 26 and 27 Wood and Brook's Subdivision.

Lots 19, 20, 21 28, 29, 30 Judson's 2nd Addition.
