An Ordinance to Establish Rules Regulations Relative to Fairview Cemetery and to Enforce the Provisions Thereof.

The Common Council of the City

of Ann Arbor Ordain:

1. The authority and conditions on which lots are sold and the restrictions on transfers shall be made only in conformity with the terms of deeds.

2. The Cemetery hereafter provided for, desires to inches in height; and stone

3. Lot owners may have planting or other work done on their Storm sewers: Forest ave. storm lots at their expense upon application to the Sexton. No work-Cemetery will be admitted to cemetery (to perform labor) except for the purpose of stone work, except by permission

from the Sexton.

4. No iron or wire work and no seats or vases will be allowed lots, excepting by permission of the City, and when any article made of iron begins to rust the same may be removed from the Ceme-

tery.

- 5. The Cemetery Committee desires to encourage the planting of trees and shrubbery, but, in order to protect the rights of all and to secure the best general they require that such planting shall be done only in accordance with the direction of the Sexton of the Cemetery.
- 6. No coping nor any kind of inclosure will be permitted. boundaries of lots will be marked by corner stones which will be set by the Sexton with the centres upon the lines bounding the lot. Corner stones must not project above the ground and must not be a tered nor removed.
- 7. No lots shall be filled above the established grade.
- 8. All interments in lots shall be restricted to the members of the family or to persons whose burial on lot is approved by the next of kin of the owner.
- 9. No disinterment will be allowed without the permission of the Cemetery Committee and City Health Officer, and the lot owner or the next of kin of the deceased.

10. Mounds over graves should Committee, be kept low, not exceeding four other inclosures around

13. Only one monument will be permitted on a family burial lot.

14. (a) No monument allowed over six feet in height unless approved by the Sxeton and the

(b) Grave markers or head appoint stones must not exceed two feet members to be known as the Cemin width and one foot in thickness, nor be set more than eighteen inches above the level of the No marker less than six inches in thickness will he allowed, but duplicates of markers already on the lot may be permitted.

15. All stone and marble work, monuments and headstones, must be accepted by the Sexton as being in conformity with the fore-

ion of any rule.

21. The Common Council may appoint a Sexton of the said Cemrecommendation etery upon the Ceme.ery Committee who shall perform the duties of the Sexton thereof and whose duties shall be such as shall be conferred by this ordinance and by such other rules and regulations as shall be from time to time prescribed.

22. It shall be the duty and right of the Cemetery Committee from time to time to lay out and alter such avenues and walks, and to make such rules and regulations for the government of the grounds as they deem requisite and proper and calculated to secure and promote the general object of

Cemetery.

23. The Sexton is directed to enforce the above regulations and to exclude from the Cemetery any willfully violating person same.

## Resolution Ordering Issue of Curb and Gutter Bonds

Whereas, the Common Council has authorized the construction by the Board of Public Works of culbs and gutters, known as Curb and Gutter Districts No. 24, No. 28, and Nos 50 to 61 inclusive, and the Common Council having caused to be certified to the City Assessor the lands, tenements and premses to be assessed for costs of said public improvements, street intersections and fifty per cent of the balance excepted, therefore be it

Resolved and it is hereby ordered that the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and required to execute, under their hands and the seal of the City of Ann Arbor, curb and gutter bonds of the City of Ann Arbor under date of January 3rd, 1924, as follows: for District No. 24, \$1,286.29; for District No. 28, \$1,990.22; for District No. 50, \$3,219.85; for District No. 51, \$576.81; for District No. 52, \$1,031 41; for District No. 53, \$665.-54 for District No. 54, \$560.48; for District No. 55, \$569.18; for District No. 56, \$5,936.40; for District No. 57, \$2,275.04; for District No. 58, \$692 51; for District No. 59, \$1.592.36: for District No. 60, \$1,-040.95; and for District No. 61, \$1 493.22 that being the cost of such respective curbs and gutters, said bonds payable to bearer in equal four annual installments from and after the third day of

January, 1924, at the office of the Gram, City Treasurer, with interest at five per cent per annum, payable annually on the third day of January in each and every year, principal to be payable at the option of the City Treasurer pursuant to ferred mittees.
