All sidewalks hereafter graded, constructed, repaired or renewed in said city shall conform to the grade lines established by the Common Council and to such specificat ons in regard to width, materials and mode of construction as shall be approved by the Common Council, and such specificat ons shall be of the same force and effect as though incorporated at length in this ordinance

We also find that owing to the fire which exists in the dump, the smoke gases and steam caused by the firt and emitting from said dump, are such as to be decidedly obnox ous and injurious to the and comfort health of the surrounding neighborhood, thereby creating a nuizance and a menace to health

Owing to the above existing condit ons it is the opinion of this committee, that the entire situa-tion can and should be controlled the Health Officer, who, by power vested in him by the State of Michigan and the charter of the City of Ann Arbor, has absolute authority in all matters concerning public health.

We respectfully recommend the

fol'owing rules:-

All dumping shall be done within the hours specified by the Health Officer.

All inflammable materials shall be separated by the hau er, and shall be placed in spot designated by the caretaker, to be burned bp the caretaker at his discretion; the balance of the rubbish and debris to be placed by the hauler, wherever the caretaker ahall designate.

We further recommend, that a gate be placed at the entrance; also that notice of the hours allowing dumping be posted thereat, with notice of penalty said notice to be signed by the Health Officer.

In making the above report, the committee respectfully recommends that the Health Officer make whatever further rules he shall consider necessary for the maintenance of a well regulated dump, and shall immediately demand a strict compliance of the same.

The Health Officer is hereby author'zed to demand from Police and Fire Departments any assistance he deems necessary for the regulation and enforcement of rules for public dumping grounds.
