Sidewalk Committee Report.

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your Sidewalk Committee respectfully recommends that the following sidewalks be ordered built and the following resolution adopted.

Resolved, That the grading and construction of the sidewalks hereinafter mentioned is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Therefore, It is hereby ordered that Portland cement concrete sidewalks be graded, built and constructed in the City of Ann Arbor on and along the following property; width of walk to be five feet unless otherwise stated:

New walk on the south side of John K avenue from Fred Fahrner property to Main street.
