City of Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Gentlemen: In re. Matter of state roads, etc.

Please be advised that it is my opinion that any state owned road within the city of Ann Arbor would not be available for use in the laying of public utility lines, etc., unless the City of Ann Arbor made some special arrangement to procure such rights of way and also with the right of the adjacent property owners to make connection to such utility lines.

This proposition is different than the ordinary one wherein the state requires a central twenty feet, as in practically every case the City owns several feet on either side of the twenty foot strip and therefore has an

lines. Also, the question arises as to the right of a municipality to cut this pavement for the purpose of laying such utility lines.

It would seem to me that, in passing any resolution regarding the matter of such highways, some provision should be made for the right of easement either by the city or utility bodies and the property owners to lay lines and make connections.

I give this opinion in accordance with a request made by your Honorable Body at the last meeting of the Common Council.

Resolution Ordering Pavement Bonds.

Whereas, this Common Council has authorized the construction by the Board of Public Works of pavements in Pavement Districts Nos. 70 and 71, and this Common Council having caused to be certified to the City Assessor the lands, tenements and premises to be assessed for the cost of said public improvements, street and alley intersections and twenty per cent of the balance excepted, therefore be it

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and required to sign and countersign

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respectively and execute, under their hand and the seal of the City of Ann Arbor, pavement bonds of said city under date of January 4, 1926, as follows, to-wit: District No. 70, the sum of seven thousand five hundred eighty-seven and 3-100th dollars; District No. 71, the sum of five thousand, fifty-nine and 68-100ths dollars; that being the cost of said public improvements, payable to bearer in ten equal annual installments beginning August 1, 1926, with interest at four and one-half per cent per annum, payable annually on the first day of August in each and every year, as evidenced by interest coupons to be thereto attached.
