Section 1. That the name of the street heretofore known as Chubb Road be and the same is hereby changed and shall hereafter be known as Sunset Road.

Section 2. That the name of the street heretofore known as Arbor Drive be and the same is hereby

changed and shall hereafter be known as Allen Drive.

Section 3. That the name of the street heretofore known as John K. Street be and the same is hereby changed and shall hereafter be known as Koch Avenue.

Section 4. That the name of the street heretofore known as Park Terrace be and the same is hereby changed and shall hereafter be known as Felch Park Terrace.

Section 5. That the name of the street heretofore known as Ingalls Street, from Granger Avenue to Dewey Avenue, be and the same is hereby changed and shall hereafter be known as Sheehan Avenue.

Section 6. That the name of the street known heretofore known as Sixth Street, from Liberty Street north, be and the same is hereby changed and shall hereafter be known as Mulholland Avenue.

Section 7. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after legal publication thereof.

Traffic Committee Report

To the Honorable, the Common Council,

Your Traffic Committee, to whom was referred the communication from the Parent-Teachers' Association of the Angell School asking for more police protection for children going to and returning from school, has had the same under consideration. We find that a policeman is being stationed at the dangerous intersection of Washtenaw and South University Avenues three times each day for periods of 40 minutes each and that with the present police force more service is not available.

Your Committee makes the following recommendations:

That the petition of R. L. Savery for a "no-parking" space of 15 feet in front of 206 West Washington Street be granted.

That a "no-parking" space be maintained between the center line of the street and the curb on the South side of West Huron Street between Ashley Street and the alley at rear of the First National Bank Building. This re-

striction to be in force both day and night.

That the City Marshal place "no-parking" signs in accordance with the above regulations.
