Resolved, that we recommend that the block bounded by Miller Ave., N. First, Kingsley and N. Ashley Sts. be changed from Class "B" residence to Class "C" local business.

That a parcel of land 132 feet deep abutting on west side of N. Ashley St. and extending from Felch St. to Kingsley St., be changed from Class "B" residence to Class "D" commercial and industrial district, also that the west half of block bounded by Kingsley, N. Main, Felch and N. Ashley Sts. be changed from Class "B" residence to Class "C" local business.

This leaves the Department two men short of its full quota of 29 men. We have several applicants under consideration and within a short time we hope to be able to report to you that the other two positions on the force have been filled.

Your Board of Police Commissioners has adopted a resolution to the effect that all new men appointed to the Force shall be on probation for a period of six months,

So that your Honorable Body may be fully advised of the changes in the force, as shown by the foregoing statement, we respectfully advise that the only changes are the addition of the six new men and the increasing of the salary of Sergeant Cook from \$166.00 per month to \$175.00 per month and the appointment of Patrolman Mortensen as a Police Sergeant, and the discontinuance of the office of Lieutenant of Detectives and continuing two men on the force as plain clothes detectives. The officer holding the title of Lieutenant of Detectives being now placed upon the same salary basis as the other plain clothes detective.

We respectfully request your approval of the foregoing changes.
