Sidewalk Committee Report

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your sidewalk Committee respectfully recommend that the following sidewalks be ordered built and the following resolution adopted:

Resolved, That the grading and construction of the sidewalks hereinafter mentioned is deemed and declared to be necessary public improvements.

Therefore, It is hereby ordered that Portland Cement concrete sidewalks be graded, built and constructed in the City of Ann Arbor on and along the following property; width of walk to be five feet unless otherwise stated:

East Ann Street

North side, from Main to N.

Fourth Ave. Reset Curb.

From 927 eastward to 1019.

South side, 816 Driveway; 820; 920 three blocks and driveway; 922 one block.

The N 57 ft. of lot 1 and the N 5 rods of lots 2, 3, and 4, B 2 N, R 4 E.

Lots 1 and 2, B 2 N, R 13 E, Eastern Add, also land lying W. of said lots platted as 12th St.
