This recommendation is made without regard to any petitions filed and is based solely upon the opinion of the Board as to the materials best suited for pavement on this particular street.

No. 99, was awarded to Lewis & Frisinger and the bids of curb and gutter by Lewis & Frisinger and L. W. Dailey on said street were the same. On motion of A. d. Slauson, the regular order of business was suspended by unanimous vote of members present to receive report from the special committee of engineers relative to proposed bridge over Michigan Central Railroad.

Mr. Henry C. Riggs addressed Council and presented the following report:

March 16, 1928.

To the Honorable the Mayor and City Council,
Ann Arbor, Michigan.
Gentlemen:

I respectfully report that the special committee of engineers selected to co-operate with City Engineer Sandenburgh have had four meetings. Some six or seven different plans for layout in the vicinity of the Michigan Central Station have been discussed and the committee finally agreed upon one of these plans.

This has been taken up with the Michigan Central engineering officials and we are assured of their complete acceptance of the plan. The City Engineer's associates and the Michigan Central engineers have checked estimates for the completed work and are in agreement that the entire cost will approximate \$300,000.

No official negotiations have been as yet had with the Company relative to apportionment of cost but we have been assured that the Michigan Central Railroad would co-operate fully with the City and would be prepared to at once undertake the construction and pay its share of the expense.

It would seem therefore that the next step would be to appoint representatives of the City to negotiate an agreement with the Michigan Central.

Your committee has also taken up with the State Highway Department the question of State partici-

pation. It appears that under the law the State cannot pay any part of the cost of bridges within the city limits but we are assured by Mr. Rogers that the State will be prepared to pave the central 20 feet of such part of the street as has to be repaved north of the bridge and the State probably will be willing to pave the central 20 feet of Beakes Street from the south end of the bridge to Main Street. We therefore recommend that representatives be appointed to officially negotiate with the State.

Special Committee Report

To the Honorable, the Common Council,
Gentlemen:

Your Special Committee, to whom was referred the matter of providing fire protection to property outside the corporate limits of the city and reciprocity with fire departments of neighboring cities and villages, respectfully recommends that the Board of Fire Commissioners be instructed not to furnish fire protection to property outside the corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor, except to neighboring incorporated cities and villages and such persons or communities which have made arrangements with the Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor for such fire protection, and then only when fire equipment is not needed in the City of Ann Arbor.

We further recommend that the

City Clerk be instructed to send a copy of this report to cities and villages within a radius of 25 miles and to the township clerk of Ann Arbor Township.
