It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or company to operate or propel "D"-Commercial and Industrial any machine, vehicle, tractor, digger, or engine, over, along, upon or across, any of the street pavements within the City of Ann Arbor, equipped with lugged wheels, or wheels with pins therein, or with wheels so constructed that the pavement will be damaged by the use thereof. All such machines, vehicles, tractors, diggers or engines shall be placed upon suitable conveyors when transported over, along, upon or across any of the said street pavements, so that the lugs, pins, or other devices will not come in contact with the said pavements.

Section 2. Any person, firm, corporation or company violating the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof in a court of competent jurisdiction, be punished by a fine not exceeding One Hundred Dollars and the costs of prosecution, to be taxed by the court, or by imprisonment in the Common Jail of Washtenaw County, or the Detroit House of Correction at Detroit, Michigan, for a period not to exceed ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court; and upon the imposition of any fine hereunder the court shall have power and authority to make an order that the person so fined shall be imprisoned in either of the before named jails, until such fine is paid, not to exceed, in all, the period of ninety days.

Section 3. All ordinances, and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
