May I suggest that the registration office be kept open during the noon hour and remain open 8:00 p. m., from now on. Also that the registration office be moved into the mayor's office on the ground floor, thereby saving many hundreds of people the necessity of climbing the stairs as at presevery polling place from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p. m.

Give this wide publicity in any one or more of the following ways:

Advertise in newspapers.

stores and shops.

Put up posters.

Put banners or cards on busses, trucks, etc., their owners permitting.

Provide "stickers" for windshield
