Sewer Committee Report

To the Honorable, the
Common Council,
Gentlemen:

Your Sewer Committee, to whom was referred the estimate and report of the City Engineer relative to construction of lateral sewer in Lateral Sewer Dist. No. 177, on Arbor View Blvd. from Ravena Blvd. to Wildwood Ave. and on Wildwood Ave. from Arbor View Blvd. to Harbrooke Ave., has considered the matter and heard all persons desiring to be heard in the premises, and your committee is of the opinion that there is necessity for the construction of said lateral sewer and recommends that special taxing or assessment district be fixed by the Common Council upon and against which the construction of said sewer be charged, street intersections excepted, pursuant to the ordinance in such case made and provided, and that resolutions fixing the boundaries of said sewer district be prepared by the City Engineer.

We further recommend that the plans, specifications and estimates of cost for the following storm sewers be approved: On Abbot Ave. from Ravena Blvd. to city limits and on Montgomery Ave. from Abbot Ave. to W. Washington St., on Buena Vista Ave. from Murray Ave-Washington St. drain northerly 380 feet, on Highland road and Lenawee drive from Awixa road to Concord road, on Onondaga St. from Geddes Ave. to Seneca Ave.

We further recommend that the Board of Public Works be instructed to advertise for bids for the construction of the foregoing lateral and storm sewers and that the construction of said sewers is hereby deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.
