To the Honorable Common Council of
the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Gentlemen:

I beg to advise you that City Attor-
ney Butterfield and myself visited De-
troit yesterday and had an interview
with the officials of the Detroit, Ypsi-
lanti and Ann Arbor Railway in
regard to paving Main street, and I
desire to say that there appears to be a
difference or misunderstanding regard-
ing the terms of the last Franchise.
We are able to report however that
the Company is willing to make a con-
cession and now practically agree to do
all that we require and I hand you
herewith their written agreement to
do this and it also shows what they
desire in return being a Y at the cor-
ner of Main and Ann street and to have
from six months to one year to pay for
the pavement.

I believe the Y is allowed them
under a former Franchise and am in-
formed that the payment of the amount
required can be secured by a proper
bond and to prevent delay and serious
inconvenience to the business men and
property owners on Main street and
with a disposition to meet them on
reasonable terms I recommend the
acceptance of their proposition and

that the order to commence suit be
reconsidered.

To the Common Council of the City of
Ann Arbor:

Gentlemen:

While we do not concede the cor-
rectness of the legal attitude assumed
by the City, in order to avoid friction
and for the sake of harmony we hereby
propose that we will replace our pres-
ent equipment on Main street, be-
tween Catherine and William Streets,
with iron poles, grooved girder rails and
steel ties on concrete foundation; and
we will enter into a contract for the
pavement of the street between the
rails on the portion of the street afore-
said; at the rates paid by the City for
similar work, one half to be paid for in
six months and the balance in twelve
months from the date of the contract;
provided we are permitted to construct
a "Y" at the corner of Main and Ann
streets.

the rails *only* shall not apply to future
contracts for paving streets upon which
the street car lines run.

from center line of Catherine street to the center line of Depot street be, and the same is hereby changed from the present grade and fixed and established so that the grade on and along such street shall be as follows, that is to say:
