University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Mich., April 10, 1917.

Ann Arbor City, Mr. Isaac Reynolds, Clerk; Dr. John A. Wessinger, Health Officer: Gentlemen—In order that your records may be complete, I beg to transmit to you below the following resolution with respect to additional Contagious Disease Hospital space, adopted by the Regents of the

University at their meeting of March 30:

Resolved, on condition that the City of Ann Arbor will provide funds for the purpose of building a contagious disease hospital, that the University of Michigan will furnish a site for the same, and agrees to equip and maintain it after completion. Such hospital shall be for the sole use of patients taken sick of contagious diseases in the City of Ann Arbor, and such hospital shall be conducted under such conditions as shall be arranged between the City of Ann Arbor and the Board of Regents.

I regret that owing to absence from the city and pressure of work it has been impossible for me to send you this formal notice at an earlier date. Yours truly, S. W. Smith, Secretary.
