City clerk reported that Detroit, Jackson and Chicago Railway company filed on October 6, 1922, acceptance of "A resolution defining the terms and conditions upon which the street railways are to be maintained and operated in the city of Ann Arbor," which resolution was adopted by common council October 2, 1922; and in behalf of said city and in pursuance to the resolution of common council the mayor and city clerk executed and accepted said resolution under the date of October 6, 1922.

Communication received from S. W. Smith, secretary of University of Michigan, relative request of council that university construct a new walk along their property on S. side of E. Huron-st. from W. line of power plant east to Fourteenth-st., stated that regents desired to postpone the building of this walk as they expect to extend power plant.

Alderman Johnson called attention to dangerous condition of walk, matter was referred to Alderman Freeman to confer with university authorities.
